Modus operandus: SB-FIT

- Financial resources for the programme are provided by the MS from its national budget to establish the SB-FIT;
- A Joint Steering Committee (JSC) will oversee the FIT and identify projects and activities for implementation;
- UNESCO will be responsible for the implementation of agreed projects/activities;
- UNESCO's rules and regulations, including for procurement, are applied for projects and activities;
- Where desirable and possible additional resources will be mobilised from other sources (private, ODA partners).
